Sunday School Update

Our adult Sunday School classes began meeting on a limited basis in November. Each adult class met once per month during November and December. Then we made some adjustments to allow each class to meet twice per month in January and February. Heather Jackson agreed to teach the preschool children on the same Sundays that Life Connections had class.

As of March 14, we are adding the youth class and a children's class for grades 1-5. We will continue the every-other-week rotation until mid-April, so all classes will be able to meet at least twice a month. This will allow time for additional folks to receive a vaccine and for us to get additional classrooms ready. During this time, we ask that the children wear masks during Sunday School. Additional cleaning may also be needed and will be coordinated with the teachers.

Beginning on April 18, all classes will return to Sunday School at 10:00 each Sunday. They will meet in their own rooms. Some of the classrooms are small and may not allow social distancing for a large number of class members. Masks are still recommended when seating is tight.

We appreciate everyone's patience during this transition period, and we are excited to get Sunday School into a more normal routine.
