"Making the Most of Your Time"

The older you get the more you think about using your time wisely. You try to evaluate what really matters.

Ephesians 5:15, 16 "Therefore, be careful how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise, making the most of your time, because the days are evil."

Paul is teaching the believers in Ephesus how to walk or live as believers in Christ. He is telling them to pay attention to how they live. He encouraged them to live as wise not foolish people, because the days are evil. This teaching holds true to believers today.

"walk carefully" – Be alert. The objective is to stay in the will of God. Our walk in this world demonstrates that we belong to God

"walk wisely, not foolishly" – The foolish live according to the world's morals and values. They live for temporary fulfillment and pleasures. The foolish are not aware of the dangers that fill the evil days. Believers are to be aware of the dangers of not walking with God. Live according to God's standards not the world's standards.

"making the most of your time" – There is an urgency here to take advantage of time, of opportunities of service. This expresses the importance of living for God. We need to make the precious years that God has given us count for His purpose and glory. To walk wisely is to take advantage of the opportunities that God gives us.

So, how to make the most of your time? Paul tells us in 5:2 to "walk in love," in 5:8 to "walk as children of light," in 5:15 to "walk wisely." Don't be like the world around you. Be imitators of God. To do this, spend time daily in prayer and in God's word. Asking Him to guide you every step in your day. Live a life that shows you belong to God.

Our purpose here on earth is to know God and make Him known.



Ladies Outreach report on Operation Christmas Child The Ladies Outreach received this report from Kelly Mason, our local contact person for Samaritan's Purse:

Even with 2020 being a pandemic year worldwide, Operation Christmas Child continued in sending shoeboxes to the needy children around the world. Our National Leadership teams in over 100 countries worked to schedule events using the COVID 19 safety requirements. God's work was not stopped due to this crisis.

I would like to thank you and your church for partnering with us in sending many shoeboxes to give children the opportunity to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. You were part of sending over **9.1 Million shoeboxes worldwide of which over 7.8 Million were packed and processed right here in the US. Our local Midland Area Team's total for 2020 was 27,782.** Friends, that is 27,782 children who will hear about Jesus and will be invited to attend The Greatest Journey discipleship program to learn to be a disciple of Jesus. A shoebox is Multiplication of the Gospel! (One shoebox will reach approximately 8 people: the child, the child's family and friends, and in some villages, churches are started)

Thank you for being a part of this mission to help fulfill the Greatest Commission. Our church gave a total of 76 boxes. Special thanks to the Ladies Outreach for sponsoring this project and to those who packed boxes.
