Ladies' Outreach sponsors the collection of shoe boxes filled with items for boys and girls as a Christmas gift. Operation Christmas Child is one project of the Samaritan's Purse organization. OCC shoeboxes are available in the church foyer beginning September 25 through October 23.

Please fill in the sign-up sheet with the number of boxes you take. Each box already has a label to be completed, and an instruction sheet is inside the boxes. If you have empty shoe boxes at home, they can also be used. Postage is requested for each box collected by the church. The cost of postage is now \$10 per

box. If anyone wants to make a donation for the postage or extra items, instead of filling a

shoebox, please make the check payable to Florence Baptist Church and designate it for Operation Christmas Child.

Suggested items to include in the boxes are:

*WOW items – soccer ball with pump, doll, stuffed animal, or shoes

*Toys – toy cars, jump ropes, yo-yos, or toys that light up and make noise (include extra batteries)

*Personal care items – toothbrushes, washcloths, bar soap, combs or hairbrushes

- *School supplies pens, pencils, sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks or paper, coloring and picture books, or solar calculators
- *Accessories socks, sunglasses, jewelry and watches, or flashlights (with extra batteries)

The items listed here should NOT be included in the shoe boxes: toothpaste, candy, gum, food, used or damaged items, scary or war-related items, seeds, liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items or glass containers, and aerosol cans.

After filling your box, please mark the label as **boy or girl** and also mark the applicable **age group**. If you pay the postage amount, please make the check payable to the church, as instructed above. The filled shoe boxes should be returned to the church no later than Sunday, November 6.
